





Novelist uses Anywhere and Everywhere Approach for Self-published Debut

Ubiquitous and Platform Agnostic, “Ladies and Gentlemen...The Redeemers” is Released as a Free eBook



Lafayette Hill, PA (October 26, 2010) – Emerging novelist Michael Scott Miller has taken the world of self-publishing to another level to reach audiences for his debut novel, *Ladies and Gentlemen...The Redeemers*. Amazon.com, Apple’s iBooks store, Smashwords.com, Free-ebooks.net, barnesandnoble.com, Feedbooks.com, and goodreads.com are just some of the more than twenty locations online where Miller’s book can be read, downloaded, or otherwise accessed.

The price? Miller is offering the novel free, for a limited time, at each of these eBook websites with the exception of the Kindle Store where the book is at Amazon’s minimum price of \$0.99. Formats? The eBook is readily downloadable as a .pdf, .epub, .mobi, .lit, and other formats, making it readable on the Kindle, iPhone, iPad, Android phones, Blackberry, Sony Reader, nook, and yes, the plain old computer.

“By offering the eBook for free, the novel has been able to get traction more quickly,” says Miller. “An increasing number of readers are browsing these sites looking for interesting, free reads.” At one site alone, the book has had over four thousand downloads and several other sites are in the hundreds, during what Miller has termed his soft launch. “I am starting to market the book more aggressively now, but the tremendously flattering reviews it has received so far have already made this venture personally satisfying,” he adds.

Miller’s book follows the story of Bert Ingram, a successful rep in the music industry, who has lost his way. The perpetual dreamer decides to put together a band, recruiting musicians whose only thing in common is their need to overcome a significant obstacle in their lives. 


I have two addictions - books and music. Awhile back, I stumbled upon something that brilliantly combined these two things - a book called [Ladies and Gentlemen...The Redeemers](#). I truly loved this book. While the focus is music, it is so much more than that. After reading it, I contacted the author, Michael Scott Miller, and asked if he'd be a guest on my blog. And, yes, you guessed it, Michael joins me here today.

Before we get to the book, let's learn a bit about the author:

Now a little about Michael's book:

Desperate for redemption, the perpetual dreamer decides to put together a band, recruiting musicians who have only one thing in common: the need to overcome a significant obstacle in their lives. The volatile mix of the musicians' personalities and backgrounds threatens to derail the band at every opportunity, but in time, the Redeemers begin to realize they have more to gain from one another than they ever could have imagined.

I love to know the inspiration behind the writing. Where did the idea for [Ladies and Gentlemen...The Redeemers](#) come from? Here's what Michael had to say:

The first spark of an idea for *Ladies and Gentlemen...The Redeemers* came to me about ten years ago when I was riding the train into center city Philadelphia for my job at the Philadelphia Inquirer and Daily News. I took the train only infrequently, but whenever I did, and walked through Suburban Station, I would routinely see singers or musicians performing in the corridors there. My mind first wandered to wondering what would happen if someone gathered together these seemingly destitute folks and molded them into a musical act. Could they come together with a music industry promoter and be turned into a successful band?

This thought stayed with me trip after trip, until it finally struck me that while I might not have the necessary skill set to form and promote a musical act, the idea might make for an interesting tale.

Initially, I thought the name of the book and the band would be the Subway Surfers, comprised solely of musicians recruited from the subway corridors. However, as I developed the story line, it became apparent that the story would work more effectively if the characters had a greater diversity of backgrounds and baggage, which ultimately led to the concept of the Redeemers.

Writing the novel was one of the hardest things I've ever done, but I am so glad to have done it. As a consumer of entertainment (books, movies, music), there has always been a piece of me that wanted to also be a producer of entertainment and give something back. It has been tremendously rewarding for me to see that people literally all over the world have read the novel and the positive feedback I have received has been fulfilling.

There are two things that I've heard most consistently from those who've posted reviews of the book. One is that the story is uplifting. I don't want to give away the story line so I won't say much, but the sense of redemption and fulfillment that pervades the novel resonates with readers. The other is that the book is filled with characters that grab hold of the reader. Each of the Redeemers, in his own way, creates a bond with the reader.

At the outset, I only released the book digitally, but by making it available at more than twenty locations on the internet, it has been downloaded more than seven thousand times. Understanding that the reading world is still a bit away from going completely digital, I released *Ladies and Gentlemen...The Redeemers* in paperback in December and it is now available at Amazon.

Presently, I am in the market for an agent to represent me with the hopes of bringing the book to one of the big publishing houses. Who knows, maybe one day, *Ladies and Gentlemen...The Redeemers* could even be a movie.

This book would indeed make a great movie!




